The Facebook page, which has been in existence about 2 months, is thanks to the initial work done by Dr Rebecca Mitchell, and our Secretary, Tony Gray. Content is now being added by a new committee member, Louise Goodall.

The idea of using social media is to give the Patients Group more visibility, and easier access for all the patients who are registered with the Practice. As a committee we speak on your behalf but aren't always able to do so with the knowledge and input of more than a small number of people.

We hope to use the Facebook page to gather comments from patients on various aspects of Practice activities, and to collect responses to local, regional and national questionnaires which come up from time to time.

The PPG has been in existence since 2004, in a variety of guises and we currently have a full committee of eleven people.

In the past any monies raised were used to buy equipment for the Surgery, more recently we have taken older patients in the Practice, who may not have much social interaction, out of their homes on an 'away day', for lunch and a little entertainment. We hope the Facebook page will help us access more of the people who could take advantage of a day out.

We raise funds mainly by the sale of books and DVDs in the 'book room', opposite the dispensary, and by selling Christmas Draw raffle tickets during the Flu Jab days in late September and early October, and the run up to Christmas. After the Flu Jab days, tickets will be on sale at reception.

If you would like to support our fund raising...a donation of books (in good condition) and unwanted DVDs would be most appreciated (you can leave them with reception), and remember to bring some money when you come for your flu jab.
